Cash Load Assistance Program gives additional student aid

Carmona initiated the Cash Load Assistance Program (CLAP) as additional help to the student learners of the municipality for their online classes amid the ongoing CoVid-19 pandemic.

CLAP is a load assistance amounting to P 500 for every student from Kinder to Senior High School in all public schools in Carmona.

"We all know the challenges and struggles of every student as they adopt to the distant learning program thru online classes," Municipal Mayor Attorney Roy Loyola.

The distribution of the CLAP commenced on Saturday, February 5 which benefitted a total of 1,744 students belonging to Barangays 1 to 8 initially, who are all registered in the Learners Information System.

Distributions held in two separate venues: TRECE MARTIRES, Cavite - the Municipal Town Plaza for The municipal government of Barangays 1-7 claimants while Carmona Elementary School accommodated the parents/ guardians of students from Barangay 8.

The program serves as an additional support to the students for their online mode of learning since the LGU provided funds for the 100 Mbps internet connection in all schools in the municipality and in addition to the limited Free WiFi connection project provided by the Provincial Government of Cavite.

omicron 2nd variant case detected in Tanza town

TRECE MARTIRES, Cavite -The Rural Health Unit (RHU) of the municipality of Tanza reported the detection of another patient positive with the COVID-19 omicron variant in the locality on Friday, January 29, 2022.

Municipal Health Officer Dr. Ruth Punzalan confirmed the report, identifying the 2nd case as a 49-year old male who tested positive with the RT-PCR test on December 24 but was confirmed as omicron variant thru genome sequencing on January 27.

According to Dr. Punzalan, the said patient had fully recovered as well as the rest of his family dispelling fears of further transmission.

It could be recalled that around the third week of January, the RHU had reported the detection of the first confirmed omicron variant in the town, a 44-year old male who had no history of travel and had not traveled outside of

Dr. Punzalan said that the positive omicron variant case may not be the only one in the town since the rate of the transmission had been swift, increasing from 5 Active cases reported on December 27, 2021 to 75 Active cases on January 4,

"It may be assumed that the rapid increase in positive cases is secondary to the omicron variant since omicron is highly transmissible," said continue to page 3

The support includes over 3 million vaccine donations. grant aid for the procurement of medical equipment and establishment of laboratory surveillance sites, technical assistance for cold chain development, provision of Avigan tablets for COVID-19 treatment, as well as big-ticket yen loan assistance through the COVID-19 Crisis Response Emergency Support Loan (CCRESL) and the Post-Disaster Standby Loan Phase 2 (PDSL 2). Senate Bill No. 2155 which seeks to create a national virology laboratory that will study and investigate viral diseases in the country. The overall goal of the VIP is to help develop vaccines against highly pathogenic emerging viruses.

The bill, most notably, provides guidelines for the establishment and operation of testing, reference and biosafety levels 1, 2, 3 and 4 research laboratories. It likewise grants the VIP the authority to regulate the operation of the existing virology laboratory network in the country.

"These efforts avoid intended to similar situations where poorer nations are left with fewer medical resources, particularly vaccines, to address pandemics as compared to their more developed countries that have early on invested in health sciences and medical research," Go previously explained.

Aside from SBN 2155, the senator similarly pushed for the passage of SBN 2505 which will create the Philippine CDC. The bill is the consolidated version of an earlier measure he authored and filed in May 2021.

The proposed Center will be primarily responsible

for protecting Filipinos from health threats, both foreign and domestic. To accomplish this, the CDC will detect and respond to new and emerging health threats, conduct scientific research, and communicate critical health information to the public.

The bill also establishes four sub centers that will carry out the functions of the CDC, namely, (1) Center for Health Statistics, (2) Center for Surveillance and Epidemiology, (3) Center for Health Evidence, and (4) Center for Reference Laboratories.

The CDC shall serve as an agency within the Department of Health led by the Director General, with the rank of Undersecretary, and the Deputy Director General. During a state of public health emergency, all health personnel, including those employed by local government units, will directly report to the Center.

"As the COVID-19 pandemic continues to threaten the public's health and safety, we should use this time to reexamine how we can improve efforts to combat this virus, reevaluate our capabilities, review the lessons we've learned, and consider new legislative solutions that may strengthen our response to future

public health emergencies," appealed Go.

"It is imperative that we remain vigilant and focused on preventing a bigger outbreak in addition to addressing the urgent needs facing our people," he added.

SBN 2155 (VIP) is currently pending in the Committee on Science and Technology chaired by Sen. Nancy Binay while SBN 2505 (Ph CDC) is set for plenary deliberations.

To complement these efforts to increase the nation's resilience against future public health emergencies, Go had successfully pushed for the passage of 24 laws in 2021 that will upgrade existing and establish new health facilities across the country. In addition, 15 local hospital bills sponsored by the senator were recently approved on the third and final reading in the Senate last January 31.

Said bills include upgrading and increasing of the bed capacities of existing hospitals as well as establishing new DOH-run hospitals in the provinces of Albay, Bulacan, Cagayan, Cebu, Ilocos Sur, Iloilo, La Union, Maguindanao, Misamis Oriental, Nueva Ecija, Quezon, Samar and Sulu. (OSBG)

20 GenTri MSMEs benefit from DTI's LSP-NSB program

TRECE MARTIRES, Cavite – Around 20 Micro Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) from four barangays in the City of General Trias benefit from the Department of Trade and Industry's (DTI) Livelihood Seeding Program- Negosyo Serbisyo sa Barangay (LSP-NSB) program on Monday, January 31, 2022.

The beneficiaries were from Barangays Pasong Kawayan 1, Pasong Kawayan 2, Pinagtipunan and Barangay Tapia received business kits worth P8K to start their chosen businesses.

According to DTI Provincial Director Revelyn Cortez, the LSP-NSB is one of DTI's programs to aid those greatly affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

"We reach out to those communities who do not receive assistance and help them in coordination with the local government unit (LGU), Barangays, and Business Permit and Licensing Office of the locality," PD Cortez said.

Five individuals from each barangay were evaluated by DTI to determine what kind of business they wish to engage in such as sari-sari store, water refilling station, barber shop, parlor, poultry supply, bakery, fashion boutique and kakanin business.

"We expect them to grow and manage the business for their livelihood, as we require them to attend seminars prior to the distribution of seed kits to prepare them with the proper knowledge and skills on business management," added PD Cortez. DTI-Cavite also monitors the recipients with their progress and continues to guide them in terms of small business development.

During the simple ceremony, Councilor Jonas Labuguen on behalf of Congressman Luis Ferrer IV expressed the LGU's appreciation to the officials of the DTI.

identifies the following as prohibited acts:

-Wearing of t-shirts or pins, caps, or any other similar election paraphernalia bearing the names of the candidates or political party except as authorized by the Commission on Elections;

-Being a watcher for a political party or candidate during the election;

-Consistent presence in political rallies, caucuses of, and continuous companionship with certain political candidates and/or political party in said political activities, causing the employee to be closely identified with such candidate and/or political party;

-Giving personal, financial, or other monetary contribution, supplies, equipment, and materials for the benefit of a candidate and/or political party;
-Utilizing government resources such as personnel including job orders or contract of service hires, time, and properties for political purposes.

The CSC clarified. however, that civil servants are not barred from casting their votes; expressing their views on current political problems or issues; mentioning the names of candidates or parties whom they support; expressing their opinions or engaging in discussions of probable issues in a forthcoming election; or liking, commenting, sharing, reposting, and following a candidate's/party's account, unless these are resorted as a means to solicit support for or against a candidate/party during

As stated in the COMELEC-CSC Joint Circular No. 001, Series of 2016, the following are prohibited from engaging in any electioneering or partisan political activities:

-Members of the civil service in all branches, subdivisions, instrumentalities, and agencies of the Philippine Government, including government-owned-or-controlled with corporations original charters, and state universities and colleges, whether their appointments are permanent, temporary, contractual, or even casual:

-Career officers holding political offices in an acting or officer in-charge (OIC) capacity;

-Uniformed and active members of the Armed Forces of the Philippines and the Philippine National Police.

Furthermore, an employee on leave of absence is still covered by the prohibition on electioneering or partisan political activities.

Those who will be found guilty of engaging directly or indirectly in partisan political activities will be meted with a penalty of one (1) month and one (1) day to six (6) months suspension for the first offense; and dismissal from the service for the second offense according to the 2017 Rules on Administrative Cases in the Civil Service or 2017 RACCS.



Unvaxxed children allowed entry in Cavite malls

TRECE MARTIRES, Cavite -Children below 18 years of age whether vaccinated or not are allowed to enter the malls and commercial establishments in the province by virtue of Executive Order no. 4 S. 2022 recently signed and approved by Cavite Governor Jonvic Remulla, .

The above provision and other guidelines for the operations of malls in the province under Alert Level 2 starting February 1 - 15, 2022 are declared under the executive order.

Operating hours will be from 9am - 10pm and only such establishments allowed to operate under the guidelines issued by the Inter-agency Task Force against COVID-19 may open inside the

Malls and other food preparation establishments are allowed 50% of indoor and dinein capacity for fully vaccinated individuals and children below

18 years even if they are unvaccinated, while outdoor venue is allowed up to 70% capacity.

Entrance/exit points may be opened by the mall operators as they deem convenient for the mall patrons provided that physical distancing shall be implemented and frontline workers will be given priority for access to entrance/exit doors.

The order also declares that all employees and workers of the mall and the establishments operating inside the mall must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and the Minimum Public Health Standards are observed at all times inside the

Online sabong: Sa pula, sa puti!

An enabling law that will regulate online sabong, we feel, is a must if we are to avoid getting more people, much less the kids, in trouble.

With the cockpit arenas shut down by the pandemic, even the centuriesold Filipino pastime of sabong has been forced to go underground, paving the way for aficionados to embrace cyberspace to soothe their addiction. After holding cock derbies in private farms, using only laptops and cameras to livestream bloody fights between gamecocks, supporters of the sport have even gone to Congress to ask for its legalization to the chagrin of those who have been against legalized gambling.

For all the supposed benefits that the legalization of online cockfighting or e-sabong brings, many are of the belief that making it accessible to the public, much more the youth, can only bring in disastrous results.

The church, for one, has frowned on such congressional approval, saying it is contrary to the government's goal of saving young people from

While real sabong is addictive enough, online sabong, it says, is much worse because it would make such an addictive diversion closer to the innocent children.

Indeed, while traditional sabong is available only for the kind of players who would go physically to a cockfighting arena, online cockfighting can lure those who are only on social media for the fun of it, knowing that everything is only a click away.

It may also include kids who have no idea of what it is until it proliferated, mainly because the House of Representatives legalized e-sabong through House Bill 10199. This gave a 25-year franchise to Lucky 8 Star Quest Inc., which is now allowed to broadcast live cockfighting activities and derbies through online and other similar means.

Similar applications are still pending before the Senate Committee on Public Services.

Already, betting stations, similar to those in horse racing, have sprouted in the metropolis, luring the kids and the curious to the new pastime that could become another form of addiction to the unwary.

Anyone who associates addiction only with drugs, according to the church, has not really understood the nature of addiction as a mental health issue. A partylist congressman, on the other hand, has stressed the benefits of online cockfighting, saying it is a source of livelihood for many Filipinos. This came after the issue on whether or not e-sabong should be granted a legislative franchise proved to be a hot issue, especially amid the elections. Proponents of the bill, before it was passed, appealed to those against its implementation, saying when properly regulated, it will become a source of livelihood for poor Filipinos. The legislation, they say, is important as the Covid-19 pandemic caused the closure of over 3,000 cockfighting arenas nationwide, resulting in thousands of Filipinos connected to game fowl activities to lose their jobs.

They contend that this will allow the feed industry and veterinary products sector to both receive a windfall as a result of an active game fowl industry. There are an estimated 60,000 commercial breeders and 30,000 backyard breeders nationwide, with poultry supply stores at 14,000.

Pitmasters, according to them, have been also actively giving donations, ambulances and medical assistance like free dialysis, wheelchairs, etc. to the marginalized people.

The controversy over the legalization of e-sabong has drawn varying reactions from the presidential aspirants now deep into their campaigns. Manila Mayor Isko Moreno Domagoso and Senator Manny Pacquiao both said they are in favor of regulating online gambling, while Vice President Leni Robredo and Senator Panfilo Lacson expressed apprehensions for online gaming, citing the need for more discussions on the topic.

Those against legalization are of the belief illegal online sabong has something to do with the recent disappearance of several sabong aficionados and bet collectors.

This could only be the tip of the iceberg.

Even Philippine National Police spokesperson Brig. Gen. Bernard Banac admitted that they have been receiving reports of illegal cockfighting events being held secretly.

An enabling law that will regulate online sabong, we feel, is a must if we are to avoid getting more people, much less the kids, in trouble.

(Hindi ko magawang hindi magkomento sa magkaibang rehistro ng salitang "komunismo" sa magkaibang konteksto. Sa mga abanteng kapitalistang bansa, kung saan mahina o mabaho ang mga partido komunista, may tunog na abstrakto't pilosopikal ang pagteteorya ni Badiou sa "komunistang hypothesis" tipong uso sa mga klasrum at kumperensya, hindi mapanganib sa mga kolektiba at komunidad. Pero sa Pilipinas, iba ang kalagayan dahil malakas ang partido komunista na sobrang kinapapraningan ng Estado at imperyalismo.

Naalala ko tuloy ang isang kaibigang aktibistang nagorganisa ng mga magsasaka. Komo Comparative Literature ang kurso niya, may dala siyang kopya ng librong Marxism and Form [1971] ni Fredric Jameson sa kanayunan na kinailangan niyang upuan nang minsang matapat ang dyipni na sinasakyan niya at mga kasamahan sa isang checkpoint ng militar. "Ikakapahamak ko pala itong si Jameson," buntong-hininga niya pagkatapos.)

Avon kay Badiou sumisibol ang "disposisyon ng mga nagrarayot" na ipinakita ng mga mamamayan sa Tunisia at iba pang bansa sa mga tinatawag niyang "yugtong pagitan (interval period)" sa kanyang peryodisasyon, ang Numero(2)at(4)saitaas. Paliwanag niya, "May serye kung saan naililinaw ang rebolusyunaryong lohika at kung saan lantad nitong naipapakilala ang sarili na alternatiba." Sinusundan ito, aniya, "ng yugtong pagitan kung saan hindi pa naipapasa sa kahit sino ang rebolusyunaryong ideya, at kung saan hindi pa ito natatalakay, hindi pa nahuhubog ang bagong alternatibong disposisyon."

Paliwanag niya, "Sa mga panahong ganito, masasabi ng mga reaksyunaryo, dahil nga may depekto sa alternatiba, na nagbalik na ang mga bagay sa natural nilang

katayuan." Sa ganitong yugto raw, "umiiral ang diskuntento pero hindi ito mabigyang-hugis dahil hindi nito makuha ang pwersa nito sa isang pinagsasaluhang ideya. Ang kapangyarihan nito, sa esensya, ay negatibo" - ang pwersahing lumayas ang mga nasa gobyerno.

Bagamat pagbubungkos lang ng mga pangyayari sa kasaysayan ng daigdig - sa mga panahon ng paghupa at pag-agos ng mga kilusan at rebolusyong komunista, kumbaga – ang ginawa ni Badiou sa mga sulatin niya, hindi simple at sa gayo'y madaling tanggapin ang kanyang peryodisasyon. Mahigpit na kaugnay ng ganitong pagyuyugto ang sumusunod niyang hatol na laman din ng "The Communist Hypothesis":

>> "Naging angkop na kagamitan ang partido para ibagsak ang mga napahina nang rehimeng reaksyunaryo, pero napatunayang hindi angkop sa pagbubuo ng 'diktadura ng proletaryado' sa pakahulugang ibig sabihin ni Marx isang pansamantalang Estado, nag-oorganisa ng transisyon patungo sa di-Estado: ang diyalektikal nitong 'pagpanaw.' Sa halip, humantong ang partido-Estado sa isang bagong porma ng awtoritaryanismo... napatunayan na ang prinsipyong maka-Estado ay bangkarote at, sa matagalan, hindi epektibo."

>>Aniya, "Ang Marxismo, kilusang manggagawa, demokrasyang pangmasa, Leninismo, partido ng proletaryado, sosyalistang Estado... ay hindi na talaga kapakipakinabang sa ating lahat ngayon." Malinaw ang paghusgang laman ng pahayag na ito, kahit pa may kasunod na pabalat-bungang "Sa antas ng teorya, tiyak na karapatdapat sila sa higit pang pag-aaral at konsiderasyon, pero sa antas ng praktikal na pulitika ay hindi na sila magamit" – na para bang isang "propesyunal na rebolsyunaryo," sa pakahulugan ni Lenin, ang nagsasalita at hindi isang propesor ng pilosopiya.

Minsan, tinuligsa ni Badiou si Slavoj Zizek, pilosopong Slovenian na nagpapakilala ring komunista, sa paglunok ng huli sa isang butil ng propagandang kontra-Mao Zedong - at mahal talaga ni Badiou si Mao. Pero sa kanyang paghusga sa kasaysayan ng pagsasakatuparan sa komunistang hypothesis ay nilulunok din ni Badiou ang mas mapanlahat at mapaminsalang linya hinggil sa komunismo ng mga liberal na intelektwal, na lagi rin niyang tinutuligsa: "Maganda ang inyong ipinaglalaban; pero nagdudulot ng delubyo ang inyong mga pamamaraan." Hindi siya tututulan ng mga kontra-komunista sa mga prinsipyong sinasabi niyang bahagi ng komunistang hypothesis – pero todong kakampihan din siya ng mga ito sa pagwawaksi sa mga itinuturing na armas sa arsenal ng pakikibaka para sa komunismo.

Tama si Badiou sa paglulugar ng mga rayot sa Tunisia at iba pang bansa sa kalagayang mahina sa buong mundo ang mga kilusan at rebolusyong komunista. Totoo namang walang malakas na kampo ng mga gobyerno at kilusang nagsusulong ng komunismo ngayon. Ang hinala ko, sa kaso ng Egypt, hindi napatagal nang todo ni Hosni Mubarak ang pagmamaniobra at paghawak sa kapangyarihan kung mayroong malakas na kampong sosyalista sa buong mundo – kung ang bawat maliit na kaguluhan ay kapapraningan at maagap na tatapusin ng imperyalismong US dahil magdudulot ng paglakas ng nasabing kampo.

Pero humantong lang si Badiou sa malamya at malabong bisyon ng "de-Kanluranisasyon," dahil ibinabasura niya ang mga kagamitan ng mga manggagawa at mamamayan ng daigdig sa pakikibaka para sa tunay na pagbabago.

The Gold of Gabawan

FARMING is perhaps one of the most challenging yet fulfilling jobs. We often hear land tillers clamoring about their losses as they suffer devastations caused by calamities and economic crises. But, the story of the Association of Women and Men of Gabawan (AMWG) is different, it is inspiring.

group, The ventured into squash production in Barangay Gabawan, Daraga, Albay, was able to earn over P70,000 from squash in a single planting calendar.

Squash, with scientific "Cucurbita name Moschata", is a vine, creeping, and trailing crop-producing fruit. It is one of the most nutritious, delicious and versatile fruit crops in the country. Aside from its rich vitamin A, phosphorus, and calcium, several parts of the squash plant can be profitable to include its flowers that can be mixed with various dishes, and its young and tender shoots for salads.

For the Gabawan farmer's group, it was just like a gamble, they ventured into squash production without sure profit but they tried planting in one and a half hectare community garden, and lo, they harvested recently 31, 000 kilograms of squash fruits.

The association was

established on June 16, 2015, composed of 120 members from various sectors to include vendors, farmers, construction workers, tricycle drivers and other community workers. Accredited by the labor department, the group conceptualized the PISO-PISO Savings scheme where members save at least one peso a day. The accumulated savings are utilized for loans and investments.

The association was the first lucky group assisted by the Department of Agrarian Reform - Albay under its Enhanced Partnership against Hunger and Poverty (EPAHP) program - a framework to mitigate hunger, ensure food and nutrition security, and reduce poverty through the convergence of different government agencies to directly benefit family farms, farmer organizations, and marginalized sectors of the country.

Last year, the association was given P300,000 for farm and livelihood assistance. They were also given ready-to-lay chickens and ducks while Landbank of the Philippines and Gubat St. Anthony Cooperative provided not only technical assistance but also access to financial assistance. "To be a beneficiary of the EPAHP program of DAR was a great opportunity because despite the limited resources we were able to venture on this livelihood. We are also grateful for the support of various agencies," Elena Ll. Arimado, association president, said.

Before venturing into squash production, the AMWG has been producing rice, corn, and other high-value commercial crops but when Cabinet Secretary Nograles encouraged farmers to plant more squash to meet the demand for nutri-bun, a component of the government's supplemental feeding program for children, they shifted into squash production.

Unfortunately, technology adopter of nutri-bun prefers to use carrots rather than squash. To help the farmers, DAR assisted the group in marketing

the conversion of the squash plantation into a farm tourism site for a greater income opportunity. The Technical Education and Skills Development Authority trained the members on organic agriculture, the Department of Agriculture provided some postharvest facilities, the Department of Trade and Industry provided livelihood skills training, while the Department of Social Welfare and Development will provide livelihood assistance to augment their capital seed funds.

The group members, who have been affected by various challenges such as typhoons, dry spells, flooding, pests infestations, and the COVID-19 pandemic, are now elated by the opportunities and support they are reaping from the government.

True enough, like its color, the squash production of the Association of Men and Women of Gabawan is considered a "Golden Harvest" that the farmer-beneficiaries value and treasure. (OTB/PIA5/with reports





Japan boosts PH pandemic recovery measures

QUEZON CITY -- The Governments of the Philippines and Japan recently signed a grant that will boost the Philippines' recovery measures against COVID-19 thru cold chain systems.

Ambassador Koshikawa Kazuhiko attended the virtual signing of an agreement between the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) and the Department of Health for a grant assistance of 885 million yen, as part of the Government of Japan's support to the country's COVID-19 recovery efforts.

Philippine Health Secretary Francisco Duque III and JICA Philippines Representative Azukizawa Eigo also attended the ceremony as the signatories to the Agreement

The almost P400 million grant aid will provide cold chain transport and equipment throughout the Philippines.

According to the Embassy of Japan in the Philippines, the aid grant comprises more 70 than refrigerated and service truck units, 1,000 transport boxes for vaccines, ice pack freezers, thermometers, and other equipment to be deployed nationwide in partnership with the Department of Health.

Ambassador Koshikawa stressed in his speech that this assistance indicated another signpost in Japan's commitment to the Philippines' ongoing battle against COVID-19.

CSC issues reminder vs. electioneering, partisan political activity caucuses, conferences, meetings,

QUEZON CITY -- As the country began the official campaign period for the 2022 national and local elections, the Civil Service Commission (CSC) reminded civil servants not to engage in electioneering and partisan political activity.

The CSC said that such acts are prohibited under the 1987 Constitution and other laws and statutes, with the aim to ensure that civil servants are focused on the discharge of their duties and functions and to insulate them from politics.

Under Commission on Elections (COMELEC) and Civil Service Commission (CSC) Joint Circular No. 001, series of 2016 dated 29 March 2016, electioneering and partisan political activity refers to any act "designed to promote the election or defeat of a particular candidate/s or party/ies to public office." These include the following prohibited activities:

-Forming organizations, associations, clubs, committees, or other groups of persons for the purpose of soliciting votes and/or undertaking any campaign for or against a candidate/party;

-Holding political

caucuses, conferences, meetings, rallies, parades, or other similar assemblies for the purpose of soliciting votes and/or undertaking any campaign for or against a candidate/party;

-Making speeches, announcements, or commentaries, or holding interviews for or against the election of any candidate/party for public office; -Publishing, displaying, or distributing campaign literature or materials designed to support or oppose the election of any candidate/party; or

-Directly or indirectly soliciting votes, pledges, or support for or against a candidate/party.

addition, being In a delegate to any political convention, or a member of any political committee or directorate, or an officer of any political club or other similar political organizations; receiving any contributions for political purposes, either directly or indirectly; and becoming publicly identified with the success or failure of any candidate/s or party/ies are also considered partisan political activities and are grounds for disciplinary action.

PASAY CITY -- As the COVID-19 pandemic continues to impact the lives of millions of Filipinos, Senator and Chair of the Senate Committee on Health Christopher "Bong" Go supported calls for the passage of two legislative measures that will help the country better prepare for public health emergencies.

In an interview on February 7, Presidential Legislative Liaison Office Undersecretary Orville Ballitoc reiterated that President Rodrigo Duterte supports the passage of measures establishing the Virology Science and Technology Institute of the Philippines (VIP) and the Philippine Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The President had previously mentioned this during his sixth and final State of the Nation Address delivered last July 26, 2021.

"I salute President Duterte's continued leadership throughout this unprecedented pandemic and he continues to find ways to push for a more proactive approach in addressing public health emergencies of any kind," said Go.
