Silang mayor-elect inks MoU with banking institution

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite – Silang Mayor-Elect Kevin Anarna recently signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with a digital bank to promote financial inclusion through digital financial technology in the said municipality.

Few weeks before his assumption, Anarna sealed a partnership with Rizal Commercial Banking Corporation (RCBC), Asia's Money's Best Digital Bank for the next two years consecutive years to bring

Filipino BIDA, PDITR+V pandemic response hastens recovery

MANILA -- From being the last in a list of over 120 countries first measured for their ability to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic one year ago, the Philippines climbed to the 33rd spot, ahead of over 80 other countries including Switzerland

(38), Israel (44), Japan (53), U.K. (58), Canada (60), Australia (71), Hong Kong, China (71), New Zealand (75), Singapore (79), and the U.S. (89).

The Nikkei COVID-19 Recovery Index noted the consistent decline in new

infections in the Philippines, with low to no confirmed deaths in recent weeks. More importantly, these safe numbers have been recorded even as the country's borders have been open to international tourists for four months now, with tens of thousands of tourists arriving daily.

ng ating mga food sources (If we will support our farmers and fisherfolk, we will have solid foundation and solution for our food security problem and sustainability for our food sources),” she said.

Legarda, a backyard farmer, is a co-author of the Organic Agriculture Act under RA 10068, which provides for the establishment of the National Organic Agricultural Program and its amended version under RA 11511, which recognizes Participatory Guarantee Systems as a credible and affordable way to certify organic produce.

She also co-authored the Agri-Agra Reform Credit Act, which requires banks to allocate 25 percent of their loanable funds to the agriculture sector; and, the Rural Farm Schools Act, which provides for the establishment of Rural Farm Schools.

Legarda is also the co-author of House Bill 8385 or the Integrated Urban Agriculture Act of 2020, which seeks to promote and institutionalize urban agriculture by using idle lands and small spaces to plant and produce food in the community.

As Representative of the Lone District of Antique then, Legarda initiated the allocation of more funds for agricultural programs in the province, including the National Rice Program, the National Livestock Program, the National Corn Program, and the High Value Crops Development Program, and funding support

for programs of institutions such as the Agricultural Credit Policy Council, the National Dairy Authority, and the Philippine Carabao Center, among others.

She said the world is already feeling the repercussions that the Ukraine conflict has on prices and food supply. This is confirmed by the World Food Program stating that in Ukraine, more than 3 million people are now receiving food aid. High energy costs mean high prices for fertilizers.

“For small farmers, higher prices mean less fertilizer use; therefore a smaller harvest and thus also a smaller income. They also have the climate emergency to contend with,” she said. “This is yet another confirmation of the need to transition to regenerative food systems that put power back in the hands of farmers and produce using local and renewable inputs.”

According to the Food

and Nutrition Research Institute of the Department of Science and Technology, 1,717 metric tons of food are wasted each day. The International Rice Research Institute has also stated that PHP23 million worth of rice is wasted daily. This number is enough to feed 4.3 million individuals.

“Our people are hungry and malnourished, and yet we waste 1,717 metric tons of food. Imagine if every Filipino reduced their food waste. This would effectively improve the availability of food and help solve hunger while also reducing greenhouse gas emissions associated with food that is not consumed,” Legarda said.

“I am asking our national institutions and my fellow Filipinos to seriously reflect on the moral duty to change the current food system. Let us achieve food security through stronger support for agriculture and fisheries, and the promotion of regenerative agricultural systems,” she added. (PIA-NCR)

President Duterte to Filipinos: Support the country’s new leaders

MANILA -- As his term draws to a close, President Rodrigo Duterte urged the Filipino people on Monday to rally behind the country’s new leaders to enable them to continue building on the gains that his administration has achieved.

change-related projects.

They likewise discussed the priority project of Marcos regarding food security.

“I informed him about the upcoming international ministerial conference on global food security, this is also against the background of the impact of the Russian war against Ukraine with regards to the challenges on global food security,” she noted. Reiffenstuel also disclosed that they also tackled the safeguarding of rule of law and human rights. “I also underlined the importance Germany attaches to the rule of law and safeguarding human rights, and of our continued commitment to the same,” she said.

“In this context that I also mentioned, the (continuing) German support, contribution and funding of the United Nations joint program on human rights here in the Philippines,” she added.

Reiffenstuel said they also focused their discussion on renewable energy which is also among Marcos’ campaign promises to provide lower power

rates to the people.

“Renewable energies of course are of great importance to us, to Germany, and we exchanged about the experiences and the commitment and the distributions and the shares of renewable energies in our two countries’ power protections,” she added.

The ambassador noted that Marcos illustrated his early commitment to renewable energy by mentioning the wind farm in Ilocos Norte, and they agreed that there is a need to continue to deepen the discussions since this has been an area of mutual interest.

Last Monday, Marcos also met separately with ambassadors from Italy and different ASEAN countries during which they discussed expanded cooperation between the Philippines and their respective countries.

The ambassadors relayed congratulatory messages of their heads of state on his victory and affirmed their interest in improving bilateral and diplomatic relations with the Philippines. (PIA-NCR)

“Various challenges, both natural and manmade, also continue to test our resolve as a nation and a people. Let us continue to unite and show compassion with one another so we may overcome all of these challenges,” he added.

President Duterte also called on Filipinos to give the new set of leaders goodwill and best wishes so they could lead the country toward a better future. He also thanked the Filipino public for trusting his administration.

His term has been fruitful and productive with the help of the people and all sectors that could be the key in building a better future for the young generation, he noted.

BIZ iCREATE Training is one of the flagship programs of PCLEDO, a distinct ladderized training that started in 2019. “This remarkable recovery reported by independent external observers is being balanced by safety protocols managed by the Department of Health (DOH) and our partners. Our people diligently follow DOH ‘BIDA’ reminders to wear the Best-fitting mask, Isolate when sick, Double up protection with vaccines and boosters, and ensure good Airflow. Then there are surveillance systems in place as part of the PDITR+V, with capability of whole genome sequencing by the Research Institute for Tropical Medicine (RITM) and Philippine Genome Center (PGC), which allows us to detect, report, and immediately isolate any new virus sub-variants such as Omicron BA.2.12.1, BA.4 and most recently BA.5.,” explained Secretary of Health Francisco T. Duque III.

The Nikkei COVID-19 Recovery Index is an international metric that scores 121 countries each month according to their ability to reach a recovered state. Its idea of a ‘recovered’ state is one with low transmission of the virus, low death rates, high vaccine coverage, and few movement restrictions. It is based on objective measures of infection management, vaccine roll-out, and social mobility. Data are sourced from Our World in Data, Google COVID-19 Community Mobility Reports, Oxford COVID-19 Government Response Tracker, Cirium, and Nikkei Asia research. The latest ranking no longer measures testing as the indicator makes for an unfair comparison across countries due to area-specific and calibrated testing and surveillance policies.

The Nikkei COVID-19 Recovery Index has not been commissioned by any government, including that of the Philippines or its DOH. Nikkei Asia is published by Nikkei Inc. which was established in 1876, currently with 36 global bases worldwide, around 1,500 journalists, and headquarters in Tokyo, Japan.

“The DOH has always been aware that the COVID-19 pandemic response is more marathon than sprint. We are carefully pacing ourselves using the whole-of-government and whole-of-nation approach, led by President Rodrigo Roa Duterte. As the current administration ends, we are confident that the next administration and its incoming Secretary of Health will continue or even improve our march to recovery in the New Normal,” added Secretary Duque. EDITORIAL

A lot of catching up to do

That Filipino Grade 5 students, as a recent regional study showed, are falling behind their counterparts in Southeast Asia is no longer surprising given the significant percentage of them still performing at levels expected in early years of primary education.

The study, conducted by the Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization and the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), showed the percentage of Grade 5 Filipino students who achieved minimum proficiency in reading, writing and mathematics was significantly lower than in Vietnam and Malaysia.

Fifth-graders in the Philippines were at par or sometimes even worse than those in Cambodia, but performed slightly better than those in Laos and Myanmar.

Learners from selected schools in six countries that include Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar, the Philippines, Vietnam and Malaysia were assessed in three learning domains: Reading, writing and mathematics.

Majority of Grade 5 students in the Philippines had a reading proficiency level equivalent to that in the first years of primary school, with 27 percent of the students still at the level (the lowest in band scale of 2 and below to 6 and above) where they can only "match single words to an image of a familiar object or concept."

According to the study, only 29 percent of Grade 5 learners in the country are at the level where they are able to "read a range of everyday texts, such as simple narratives and personal opinions, and begin to engage with their meanings."

If ranked according to the percentage of Grade 5 students performing at or above the SDG indicator by country (band 6 and above), the Philippines is the second-worst performer with 10 percent, following Laos with only 2 percent.

Vietnam had the highest percentage with 82 percent, followed by Malaysia, 58 percent, then Cambodia and Myanmar, with 11 percent of Grade 5 students having met the minimum reading standard.

In the band 6 and above level, students are able to "understand texts with familiar structures and manage competing information."

President-elect Ferdinand "Bongbong" Marcos Jr. no less lamented the quality of education in the Philippines, saying it is indeed lagging when it comes to mathematics and sciences compared to its neighboring countries. So much so that the incoming Chief Executive expressed his desire for the Department of Education to be led by his Vice President, Sara Duterte-Carpio, to focus on science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) to keep up with technological advancements.

"Unfortunately, our educational attainment when it comes to mathematics and the sciences, we do not do very well as compared to other countries," he said in a vlog. "I think as long as we continue to push it, kayang-kaya ng mga Filipino 'yan (Filipinos can do it)," he added.

The DepEd, under the Marcos administration, will reportedly focus on improving the STEM curriculum to develop youth adept in the sciences. Indeed, that is one of the major areas that the DepEd should look at as we try to strengthen the instruction for our children and students.

Since our economy is now largely technical based, the Philippines should be able to learn how to make such technology work for us, how to improve it and apply it to our needs.

Marcos vowed to start at the primary and secondary levels, saying he will task the DepEd under VP-elect Duterte-Carpio to address the matter.

"We need the talent. That is one of the major areas that our DepEd is going to be looking at, and how to strengthen the instruction for our children and our students," he said in one report.

Producing more Filipino scientists has been a mission of Marcos even when he was still a senator.

In 2016, he reportedly lamented how the Philippines "has only around 80 scientists per million of the population when other countries have some 4,000 per million." He thereafter proposed creating science schools in major provinces and cities.

With a president focused on improving the curriculum and a vice president spearheading the agency, things can indeed only look bright for the Filipino student.

Nayong Pilipino Foundation earns COA's qualified opinion, highest in 5 years

QUEZON CITY-- The Nayong Pilipino Foundation (NPF) earned a "qualified opinion" audit rating from the Commission on Audit (COA) for its financial report for the fiscal year 2021, the foundation's highest since 2016.

Under the helm of the then newly-installed Executive Director Gertie Duran-Batocabe, it has improved its performance through strategic interventions, full implementation and compliance with the state auditors' recommendations

after the agency received a "Disclaimer of Audit Opinion" in the past year.

NPF has also made significant strides in addressing its fiscal challenges and is finally on its way to closing the gap in budget utilization. From a 56.86 percent obligation rate in 2020, the agency's budget utilization is up at 90 percent in 2021.

In a speech, Duran-Batocabe acknowledged the efforts of the employees, thanking them and said: "This honor is yours."

Since the start of the

coronavirus pandemic, NPF, an attached agency of the Department of Tourism (DOT), has been steadfast in its support of the national government's Covid-19 pandemic response while pursuing its mandate in promoting the Filipino identity and cultural heritage.

In June 2020, NPF opened its doors to host the two-hectare Inter-Agency Task Force quarantine facility and in June 2021, the agency once again paved the way to accommodate the 10,000-square-meter mega

vaccination site.

Amid the unexpected challenges, the agency has not set aside pursuing its core mandates by strengthening its programs.

The NPF produced a Conceptual Master Plan that shall serve as a compendium of site information and planning tools that can be used for the development of the Nayong Pilipino Foundation Cultural Parks and Creative Hub.

NPF also led the Museo ng Nayong Pilipino - Virtual Museum Project, a quarterly digital exhibition showcasing the various ethnographic categories in the NPF Collection.

The agency also held its first virtual Research Summit in August 2021, gathering several experts from different disciplines and attended by students from various universities and Local Government Units.

NPF's Cultural Leadership Institute was

further amplified through the MakaNayon Leadership Course, a seminar for cultural and/or tourism frontline workers.

The five-module interactive courses were recently vetted and shall serve as a resource material for a more cumulative capacity building which may be used by the DOT, its attached agencies, and other allied government institutions.

Duran-Batocabe thanked her mentors, Guiller Asido and Vincent Cañares of the Intramuros Administration, DOT Undersecretary Edwin Enrile, and DOT Secretary Bernadette Romulo-Puyat.

"I am thankful for the guidance they have given me in steering this agency to greater opportunities and assistance every step of the way," she said. "There is still much to be done, but to quote our honorable Secretary Bernadette Romulo-Puyat, 'we hope to leave it better'," she added.

This 2021 Iddu Awardee has arrived in full circle; she has made change work for women, her very essence of being one. (ALM/ADS/JCC/PIA-2)

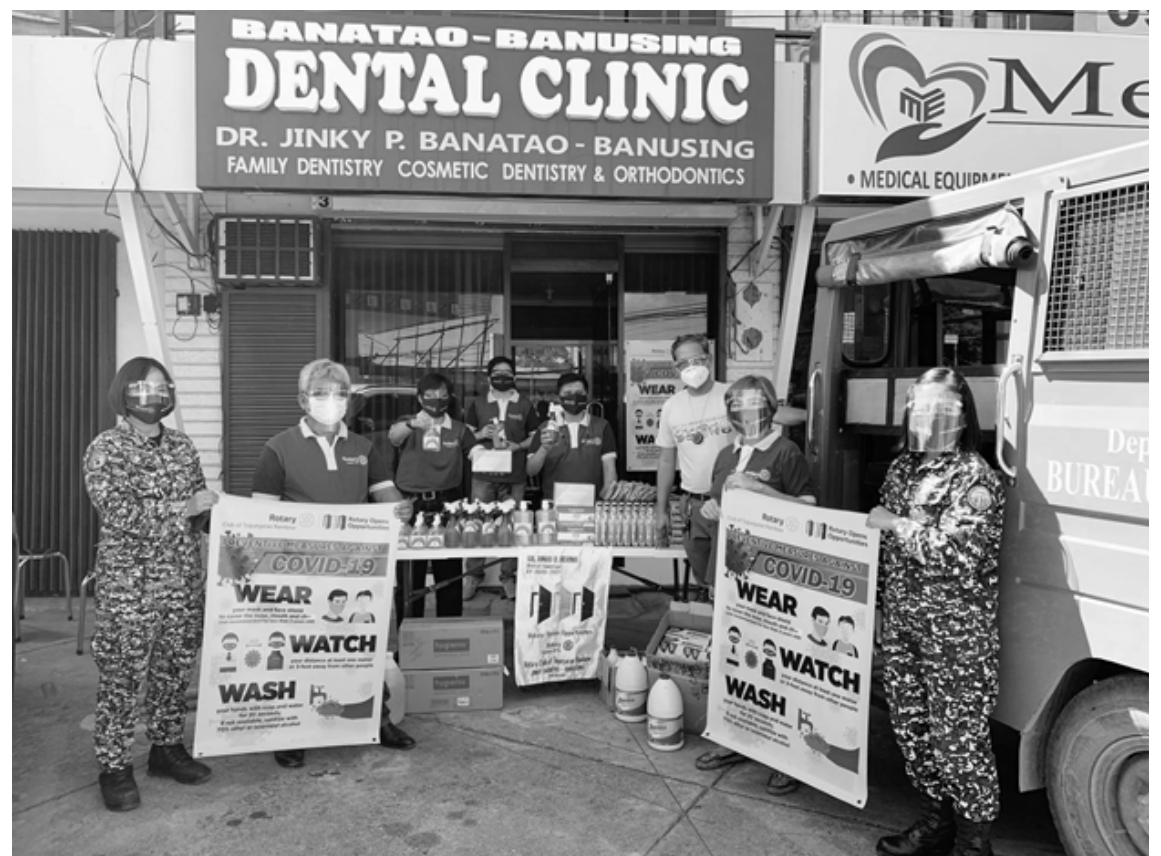

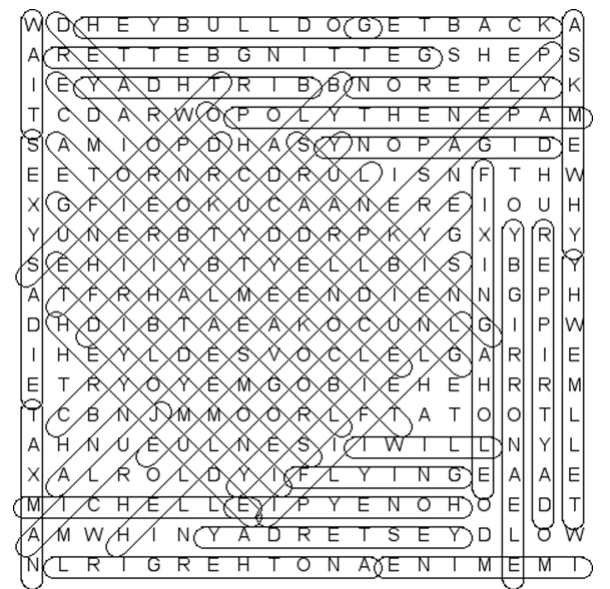

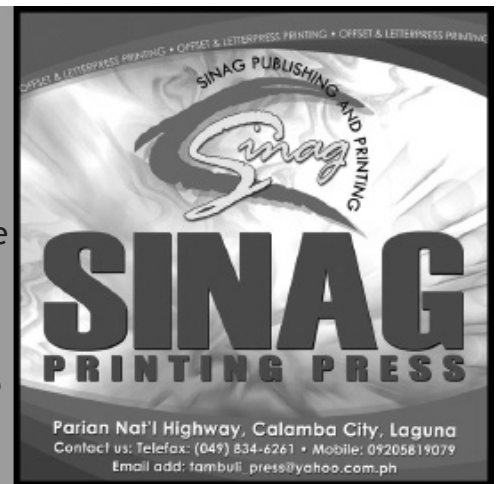

Legarda pushes for regenerative agri systems

MANILA -- Four-term Senator Loren Legarda urged the nation, most especially government institutions, to seriously reflect on the moral iduty to change the current food system.

"In an interconnected world, we are faced again with the negative implications of the war in Ukraine. Rising food and energy prices are bringing about food shortages. The conflict will have far-reaching consequences and trigger lasting crises, especially for food security, health, and even the environment," Legarda said in a news release on Thursday.

"For our world's broken food systems, the war in Ukraine should be a wake-up call for regenerative agriculture systems," she added. Legarda stressed the importance of providing necessary support

for agriculture and fisheries, especially for small farmers to enable Filipinos to have a sustainable, resilient and regenerative food system.

Marcos tackles food security, climate change, energy with European envoys

MANILA -- Food security, climate change, and renewable energy were among the topics discussed by President-elect Ferdinand "Bongbong" Marcos with ambassadors from Spain, Morocco, and Germany during separate meetings on Tuesday.

Jorge Moragas, Ambassador of Spain to the Philippines; Ambassador Mohammed Rida El Fassi of Morocco; and German Ambassador Anke Reiffenstuel

were received by Marcos separately during a series of meetings at the BBM headquarters in Mandaluyong City.

In a press briefing after the private meeting with Marcos, Reiffenstuel said apart from enhancing cooperation between their two countries, they also discussed global challenges including food security and climate change.

"We exchanged (views) about the ongoing bilateral cooperation and the cooperation

in the international frame in the multilateral formats, and discussed potentials for furthering cooperation not only on mutual interests but also to address global challenges like climate change," the ambassador said.

The envoy added that she informed the incoming president about the ongoing programs of Germany to help the Philippines in addressing climate change including their Euro25 million donation for climate
