Cavite LGUs commence Pediatric vaccination rollout

TRECE MARTIRES, CAVITE – Simultaneous with the nationwide COVID-19 vaccination for minors aged 12 – 17 years, several cities and municipalities in the province held their pediatric vaccination rollout on Wednesday, November 3.

The expansive rollout came after the successful vaccination of minors in the National Capitol Region (NCR) on October 15, 2021.

Parents accompanied children with comorbidities to vaccination sites of the respective localities such as the Primark Town Center in Barangay Magdiwang in Noveleta; Tanza MDRRM office in Daang Amaya, Tanza; Carmona vaccination hub in Barangay Cabilang Baybay; Mendez-Nuñez Rural Health Office, and the Trece Martires vaccination site at the 3rd floor of the SM City Trece Martires.

The initial rollout activities inoculated a total of *continue to page 3*

Imus SDO preps for limited face-to-face classes

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite – The Department of Education (DepEd) Imus thru the City Schools Division Office (SDO) has taken steps in preparation for the schools' readiness for the limited Face-to-Face classes with the goal of herd immunity almost in reach. One of these measures is the aggressive vaccination rollout for the employees, school heads, teachers, and non-teaching staff of the schools in the city.

According to Assistant Schools Division Superintendent Ivan Inductivo, almost 95% of the total 2,900 school employees have already been vaccinated against

CoViD-19.

“More of less 140 plus teachers and employees remain unvaccinated. They are the pregnant employees; those with comorbidities, and those who we respect their wish not to be vaccinated,” stated Inductivo.

In support of the Pediatric vaccination rollout, Inductivo said that they had commenced an advocacy campaign starting with the Parents Teachers Associations (PTA) in the city and in partnership with the City Health Office for the assessment and issuance of clearance and medical certificate to speed up processing of the immunization of the students.

Calabarzon Dagyaw tackles LGUs transition to full devolution

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna — Local government units across Calabarzon are more than ready to assume devolved functions and services as they transition to full devolution beginning next year, according to the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) Region IV-A.

This was emphasized by DILG IV-A Regional Director Ariel O. Iglesia in his townhall report during the first episode of

the Dagyaw 2021: Open Virtual Townhall Meeting in Calabarzon dubbed ‘Usapang Debolusyon Tungo sa Mas Epektibong Pamamahala’ held on Wednesday, November 10.

Iglesia said with the improved financial capability and more resources guaranteed under Executive Order No. 138, LGUs will now have meaningful local autonomy as enshrined in the Constitution.

“Masasabi nating handa na ang ating mga lokal na

pamahalaan sa full devolution dahil ngayong panahon na ito, sila ay financially capable na. They are now ready to accept the functions, services, and facilities na ita-transfer sa kanila ng mga concerned national government agencies,” Iglesia explained.

Iglesia said the devolution is not new to LGUs since it was already introduced and implemented in 1991 as mandated by the Local Government Code. However, it was not realized as the funds downloaded to the *continue to page 3*

MANILA -- The Philippine Red Cross today encouraged parents to have their children vaccinated against COVID-19.

“Through the leadership of PRC Chairman and Chief Executive Officer Sen. Richard “Dick” Gordon, we are calling all parents to have their children vaccinated against COVID-19,” PRC said in a statement.

The Philippine Red Cross Bakuna Center at the PLMC in Mandaluyong is open for the entire month of November to vaccinate minors 12 to 17 years

of age.

PRC will vaccinate minors without comorbidities with the Pfizer vaccine.

“The vaccination schedule will be forwarded to your registered cellphone number,” PRC said.

Gordon reminded the public to continue wearing face mask and face shield, observe physical distancing, observe proper hand hygiene and wash your hands with soap and water.

“Together, we will win our war against COVID-19,” Gordon said.

DA agri interventions awarded to Cavite farmers, fisherfolks

SILANG, CAVITE – The Department of Agriculture (DA) headed by Secretary William D. Dar led the Awarding and Distribution of Agricultural Interventions activity on Tuesday, November 9, 2021 at the Cavite State University (CavSU) – Silang covered court.

More than a year after the Taal Volcano erupted on January 12, 2020, the DA thru the IV-A regional office had continuously supported the fisherfolks and farmers in Cavite that were heavily affected by the natural disaster with P 176M funds allocated for the province under the Taal Rehabilitation and Recovery Program.

During the event, DA Secretary William D. Dar awarded P 144.5M of the funds to the province with a certificate of the grant received by Provincial Administrator Alvin Mojica.

A total of 103 farmers' associations or 6,384 registered farmers in twelve (12) cities and municipalities in the province benefit from the program with their representatives receiving the certificates during the event.

The beneficiaries were from the cities of Dasmariñas with 12 farmers' associations, 517 farmers; General Trias with 7 farmers' associations, 316 farmers; Tagaytay city with 9 farmers' associations, 269 farmers; Trece Martires with 3 associations, 400 farmers; and the from the municipalities of Silang with 11 farmers' associations, 1,417 farmers; Amadeo with 10 associations, 274 farmers; Alfonso with 7 associations, 492 farmers; Gen. Emiio Aguinaldo with 9 associations, 1,045 farmers; Magallanes with 11 associations, 557 farmers; Mendez with 4 associations, 174

Aside from the grant given to the province, Secretary Dar disclosed that P 7M will be given to the Cavite State University in aims to strengthen the partnership of the department with the university and support the projects that focus on agriculture. "Dapat nating suportahan ang university (CavSU) kase nandito ang mga magagaling at eksperto sa agrikultura," stated Sec. Dar. (We should support the university because the best and the experts in agriculture is here.)

The P 7M grant to the university is allocated for: the establishment of fruit trees scion group to breed all important fruit trees in Cavite as well as in Calabarzon with a P 2M fund allocated; support the upgrade of the tissue culture laboratory to cleanse the different plant varieties and produce healthy crops to be given P 3M funds; and gave one (1) unit 45Hp tractor worth P 2M to be used for the preparation of the experimental land area.

The awarding and distribution ceremony was graced by 5th District Representative Dahlia Loyola, municipality of Silang Mayor Corie Poblete, DA-4A OIC-Regional Executive Director Vilma M. Dimaculangan, Assistant Secretary for Operations Arnel V. De Mesa, Undersecretary for Operations and Agri-fisheries Mechanization, Ariel T. Cayan, DA-4A Regional Technical Director (RTD) for Operations Engr. Abelardo R. Bragas, and other DA officials, and the local chief executives of Amadeo and Alfonso, Mayor Redel B. safety and security," he added.

PGen Eleazar said he will leave with a peace of mind knowing that his successor is worthy of becoming the "27th Chief of the Philippine National Police" and knowing that the entire organization "will rally behind his leadership."

He thanked the Commander-In-Chief, President Rodrigo Roa Duterte, for believing in his capability to lead the PNP, saying, "It is my pride and honor to serve under your leadership Sir."

He also expressed gratitude to Department of the Interior and Local Government Secretary Eduardo Año for his trust, confidence and guidance.

"To the men and women of the Philippine National Police, maraming salamat sa inyong pagtitiwala at pakikisa. Please keep the torch of our reform and transformation programs burning in order to continuously remind the Filipino people of what Service, Honor and Justice mean and what Police Service really is," he said.

in inoculating millions of individuals in a single day. We will ensure that we will sustain this effort, as we continue to increase the capacities of our LGUs, address the lack of manpower in vaccination sites, and generate greater vaccine demand from our people," Galvez said.

The vaccine czar is optimistic that the country's growing vaccine inventory will be complemented by the local government units' more aggressive vaccine rollout in their respective localities.

"Everyone is now on the same page. This is because we share the same goal — our local chief executives, our business sector, and our healthcare workers — to have a merry Christmas and

prosperous 2022," he said.

"This is why we believe that the level of support coming from all levels of government as well as from the private sector should not waver and continue to intensify as we scale up our vaccination drive," Galvez added.

Galvez said a total of 121,979,340 COVID-19 vaccine doses have been delivered to the country since February. The Philippines is expecting the arrival of at least 46 million more doses in the coming days.

The vaccine czar said the administration of booster shots to healthcare workers and the third dose for immunocompromised individuals will also help ramp up the vaccine rollout within this quarter.

Galvez said he expects the Philippine Food and Drug Administration to soon release the amended Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) for the COVID-19 vaccines, as the World Health Organization – Strategic Advisory Group of Experts is also nearing the completion of its recommendation for the administration of booster shots and third doses.

"We are anticipating all these regulatory requirements to be released soon as the Department of Health is already finalizing the policy guidelines for the booster shots and third dose," he said.

More than five million individuals are expected to be eligible for booster shots and third doses of COVID-19 vaccines. (National Task Force Against COVID-19)

mobility restrictions, especially for fully vaccinated individuals, which will boost the recovery of the economy.

are given discretion to mandate the use of face shields.

For areas under Alert Levels 3, 2 and 1, the use of face shields shall be voluntary.

The abovementioned protocols are unaffected by the continued mandatory usage of face shields in medical and quarantine facilities, as well as the requirement that healthcare professionals use them in healthcare settings.

Earlier, Go has expressed his support for the proposal to make use of face shields non-mandatory but urged the public to wait for the advice of authorities and experts. He also called on Filipinos to remain vigilant amid the ongoing threats of COVID-19

protocol to prevent misencounters and ensure proper coordination and cooperation in the conduct of the aggressive campaign against illegal drugs."

21,400 PDL in Calabarzon receive Covid-19 jabs

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna — The Bureau of Jail Management and Penology (BJMP) in Calabarzon continues to promote the Covid-19 vaccination program among persons deprived of liberty (PDL) in a bid to prevent the coronavirus disease 2019 from spreading in detention centers.

In a report to the Calabarzon Regional Task Force on Covid-19, the BJMP Calabarzon said some 21,489 PDLs in the region are already vaccinated against the disease, preventing them from contracting complications should they test positive from the virus.

This constitutes around 88 percent of the target population among PDLs currently staying in detention centers managed by the BJMP Calabarzon.

Based on their latest data, there are 24,538 PDL in the region who are eligible to be vaccinated against Covid-19.

Aside from persons in conflict with the law, the BJMP Calabarzon extended its Covid-19 vaccination program to its 2,068 personnel.

In its report, around 1,988 BJMP staff have already received at least one dose of Covid-19 vaccines.

Meanwhile, 80 BJMP personnel are yet to be inoculated against the disease.

As of November 10, the BJMP Calabarzon reported 467 confirmed Covid-19 cases among PDLs under its care.

Some 452 PDLs have already recovered from the disease while four died due to complications and 11 are already released.

Meanwhile, 424 personnel tested positive from the disease, while two are currently being treated in isolation facilities.

Around 422 patients were declared as recovered, while no fatalities were reported among BJMP staff. —PB

thirty (30) minors in Noveleta town, sixty (60) children in Carmona, thirty (30) minors in Tanza, 457 adolescents in the municipality of Mendez-Nuñez, and fifty (50) minors in Trece Martires city who are expected to receive the 2nd dose of the Pfizer vaccine on November 24, 2021.

To prepare for the city's pediatric COVID-19 vaccination rollout held November 8, the city government of Imus held recently a simulation exercise at the Ospital ng Imus supervised by Imus City Health Office Medical Office IV, Dr. Ferdinand Mina.

The local government of General Mariano Alvarez (GMA) also recently held a kick-off ceremony for the town's Pediatric CoVid-19 inoculation at the University of Perpetual Help System-GMA vaccination hub.

Likewise, the municipal government of General Emilio Aguinaldo-Bailen initially

commenced its inoculation for minors aged 15 – 17 years.

According to RHU-Aguinaldo, children aged 12 – 14 years are included in the Community Based Immunization for the Anti-Measles, Tetanus, Diphtheria including the Anti HPV/Anti- Cervical Cancer for girls aged 14 years and will subsequently be scheduled for the CoVid-19 vaccination after the said CBI activities.

Meanwhile, the city government of Tagaytay thru its City Health Office announced the inoculation of the city's minors on Friday, November 5, 2021.

LGUs necessary to implement full devolution were not enough, according to Iglesia.

The EO 138 takes off from the Mandanas-Garcia Supreme Court Ruling that dictates that local government shall have a just share in the national taxes, not only in national internal revenue.

The DILG IV-A regional director said the EO 138 seeks to achieve full devolution by 2024. Iglesia also expressed optimism that the issuance of EO 138 would address the issues and gaps of the 'already in place' devolution. Bigger funds by 2022

The Department of Budget and Management (DBM) Region IV-A backed Iglesia citing that with the increased share from the National Tax Allotment (NTA) previously referred to as the Internal Revenue Allotment (IRA), LGUs will be in a better position to carry out their roles and responsibilities mandated under the Local Government Code of 1991.

DBM IV-A Regional Director Nympha Manalastas in her townhall report said the P185.17 billion or the 23.93% increase in the LGUs share in 2022 would empower them to deliver better services and implement programs as they assume devolved functions from the national government agencies.

"Sa pamamagitan ng pagtaas ng share ng mga lokal na pamahalaan sa Internal Revenue Allotment, mas kaya na nilang ipatupad ang mga dati na nilang gampanin na nakapaloob sa Section 17 ng Local Government Code of

1991 kagaya ng pagbibigay ng programa sa agrikultura, environment, primary health care, infrastructure projects, at social welfare," Manalastas said.

Manalastas said that the increased share from the IRA may serve as an inspiration for LGUs to deliver better services to the public.

"Hindi lang sana nila asahan ang ibigay sa kanila kund magsilbing inspirasyon para makapagbigay sila ng magandang serbisyo sa mga nasasakupan nila.

While LGUs are ready to assume greater roles under full devolution, the DILG and DBM both acknowledged the need to help and guide low-income municipalities or disadvantaged LGUs through the proposed growth equity fund.

Manalastas said the equity fund will be used as financial assistance to disadvantaged municipalities as they transition to full devolution. She stressed that the proposed fund amounting to P10 billion would help address issues on marginalization, unequal development, high poverty incidence, and disparities in the net fiscal capacities of LGUs. Capacity development towards full devolution

Iglesia and Manalastas in their report also highlighted the interventions of their agencies in guiding LGUs to ensure that they are well-prepared for the full devolution of basic services, functions, and facilities starting with the preparation of their devolution transition plans (DTP).

The DTP, according to Iglesia, will serve as the roadmap of LGUs in the next three years towards the full assumption of devolved functions and services. He said DILG in coordination with national and regional line agencies continuously provides capacity development interventions including a series of orientations and workshops to help LGUs align their transition plans.

The DBM meanwhile, has been in close coordination with LGUs and NGAs to ensure the harmonization of their functions and services.

"Mas malaki yung engagement na ginagawa natin, simula ng lumabas ang Supreme Court Ruling ang national government ay constant na nakikipag-dialogue para maging smooth yung transition natin," Manalastas said.

Organized by the DILG IV-A, DBM IV-A, Philippine Information Agency Calabarzon, and Partnership of Philippine Support Service Agencies, the Dagyaw 2021 aims to strengthen the public's trust and awareness on the different programs, projects, and policies of the government through open and public dialogues.

The first episode attended by around 150 stakeholders in the region centered discussions on the readiness and preparation of LGUs as they transition to full devolution.

The virtual townhall event was also graced by panel discussants from the University of the Philippines Los Baños and Institute for Leadership, Empowerment, and Democracy. — FC, PIA4A

Shields and shockers

Local governments should already be looking for ways to ensure proper disposal and recycling of these materials.

This week was certainly not boring. Amid that so-called pandemic-induced malaise affecting long-quarantined citizens, there was plenty of excitement, ranging from enthusiastic debates about the eased restrictions and use of face shields to Sara Duterte, Bong Go and Bongbong Marcos.

The issue on face shields came up once more after some local government units, including the capital City of Manila and Cebu, issued orders to make the use of face shields “non-mandatory” or “voluntary.”

In these cities, residents are no longer required to wear face shields when entering indoor spaces like malls, restaurants and other venues.

Malacañang quickly dissuaded the public about it, saying such local orders went against current national policy.

The Health department was consulted, to which Undersecretary Maria Rosario Vergeire said there is an ongoing discussion about the use of goggles and double masks in place of face shields.

She reiterated that face shields were required simply because we need to protect our eyes from exposure to the coronavirus. As Vergeire said, “Evidence shows we can get the infection through our eyes.”

The Department of Health has certainly taken its time making its recommendations. The public, as of this writing, still awaits the update on face shield use from the Inter-Agency Task Force.

Face shields, health experts agree, provide added protection. In fact, these have traditionally been used by medical personnel as part of their personal protective equipment (PPE). However, use of face shields daily has proven difficult for ordinary citizens. Together with masks, sometimes double masks, wearing it makes it hard to breath normally. Usually, people can be seen with their face shields pushed atop the head like headbands or sunglasses while walking about.

The Philippines remains one of the few countries still mandating its use, almost two years into the pandemic. Environment advocates are raising a hue and cry on the issue of waste management for items that became almost like a uniform — PPE, masks, shields. At this juncture, local governments should already be looking for ways to ensure proper disposal and recycling of these materials.

It seems, however, that more attention is being given to election matters. Lately, the resignation of Davao City Mayor Sara Duterte from her local political party, Hugpong ng Pagbabago, and Senator Bong Go’s decision to step down from candidacy have been fodder for news and speculations.

By Monday, it should all be clear — unless further events fog up our vision much like most face shields do.

Asukal sa Gatas na Pambata

ANU-ANO ang ibinebenta at ipinapabili sa atin ng patalastas ng gatas na Nido 3+ ng Nestle na pinagbibidahan nina Kris Aquino at ng anak niyang si Baby James Yap?

Sa kagyat na antas, kalusugan. Nagbibigay ito ng babala tungkol sa antas ng asukal sa mga kinakain/iniinom ng mga bata. Paliwanag ni Kris, karamihan sa mga bata ay mahilig sa matatamis (“may sweet tooth”). Aniya, dapat ay maging malay (“conscious”) ang mga kapwa-nanay niya sa antas ng asukal dahil ang mga bata, “kapag nasanay sa sobrang tamis, ang hirap baguhin.” Sa mga gatas, sabi niya, dapat suriin ang dami ng carbohydrates sa label dahil kapag mas kaunti ito sa isang gatas, mas kaunti ang asukal.

Pero tulad sa iba pang patalastas, hindi lang kalusugan ang ipinapabili ng patalastas na ito. Kinakargahan kasi ng kapitalismo ng iba’t ibang pakahulugan – sa larangan ng uri at kasarian, at sa iba pa – ang kalusugan. Hindi man laging “malay” o lantad sa isang patalastas, mahigpit na itinatalo o isinasanib ng sistemang panlipunang ito ang kalusugan sa iba’t ibang pakahulugan at disposisyon – na nagmumula at nagpapatatag din sa mga umiiral na relasyon ng dominasyon sa larangan ng uri at kasarian, at iba pa.

Kaya nagbebenta rin ang patalastas ng responsableng pagmamagulang – na, sa mga karaniwang tao, ay mas mabigat para sa mga ina. Sa hatak ng kahirapan na magtrabaho o maghanap-buhay sila, pambalanse si Kris Aquino ng Nido: kailangan pa ring maging metikoloso sila sa kalusugan ng mga anak at pangkalahatang pangangalaga sa mga ito. Kung si Kris ngang nagtatrabaho, nakakapagbayad ng yaya at, maidaragdag, hiwalay sa asawa, kinakaya. Dapat ganoon din, katulad niya, kahit ang mga karaniwang ina.

Prangka ang patalastas:

lumabas ang yaya ni Baby James na siyang mas malamang na naglalaan ng mas maraming panahon sa bata. Pero masyadong mabait pa rin ang pagkaprangka nito: saglit lang lumabas ang yaya. Makikita rito ang pagbebenta ng patalastas ng isang klase ng pagkababae – iyung kinakayang magbayad ng mas mahirap na kapwa-babae para mag-alaga sa sariling anak. Siya pa rin ang bida, dahil pinapalabas na siya pa rin ang nagdedesisyon sa kung ano ang makakabuti sa anak.

Nagbebenta rin ito ng buhay ng nakakataas na uri: magandang bahay, oras para sa pagsasama at paglalaro na hindi binabagabag ng pag-aalala ng susunod na kakainin. Hindi lang kailangang maging maasikasong ina; sa katauhan ni Kris Aquino, tungkulin itong glamorosa. Sa isang banda, ang asukal ay karugtong ng mga katangian ng maralita – lalo na sa pagyakap ng mga naghaharing uri sa “malusog na pamumuhay”: sirang ngipin, diabetes, at, para sa ilang diyetang pangkalusugan, lahat na lang ng sakit.

(Nabanggit na rin lang ang ngipin, matagal ko nang gustong pansinin: marami sa matataas na opisyal ng rehimeng Arroyo, na pursigido at brutal na nagsulong ng “modernisasyon” at “pag-unlad” na dikta ng mga mayayaman-makapangyarihan-naghahari sa mundo, ay halos sabay-sabay na nagsuot ng invisible braces: mula kina Dinky Soliman at Emilia Boncodin hanggang kina Mike Defensor at Ricardo Saludo hanggang kay Gloria mismo. Bagsak-presyo sa dentista lang ba? O may moda?)

At pwedeng sagisag ang asukal ng mga pinapalabas na bisyo ng maralita – mas ng maralita sa lungsod kaysa sa kanayunan. Para silang mga bata: mahilig sa matatamis mula sa Banana-Q hanggang mga kakanin, mula sa mga softdrink hanggang sa Jollibee. Hindi maganda sa kalusugan ang asukal, pero lagi nilang kinokonsumo. Tinatalo ng

irasyunal ang rasyunal, ng sarap ng katawan ang pagbabawal ng utak: lulong sa alak o ibang bisyo, anak nang anak, nagpapahatak sa mga kulto at bulok na pulitiko, at iba pa. (Sa kanyang librong *A Primer for Daily Life* [1991], binaybay ng feminista at Marxistang si Susan Willis ang lugar sa kasaysayan ng malawakang produksyon ng asukal. Aniya, mahalaga ang produksyon ng asukal sa mga sinakop ng mga bansang Europeo para sa akumulasyong nagluwal sa kapitalismo. Kaalinsabay, naging mahalaga ang pagpasok ng asukal sa kinakain ng mga manggagawang Europeo para paigtingin ang kanilang enerhiya para sa mas matinding paggawa sa ilalim ng bagong-silang na kapitalismo.)

Sa patalastas na ito, ang haciendera ng tubuhan at mayari ng azucarera ay nagbibigay-babala sa mga kapwa-ina na iadya sa asukal, sa ngayon para habang buhay, ang kanilang mga anak. Ang namumuhay sa pagbebenta ng ibang adiksiyon – tulad ng tsismis, game shows, telenovela at iba pang produkto – sa mga ina ay nang-aakit sa kanilang ilayo ang kanilang mga anak sa adiksiyon sa asukal. Ang yumaman sa sistemang nagdudulot ng kahirapan sa nakakarami ay nang-aakit ng pagyaman.

May tawag si Terry Eagleton, Marxistang intelektwal, sa operasyong ideolohikal na ito: Para sa mga naghaharing uri, “It’s better to appear a hypocrite than to pull the rug under one’s feet.” Para sa kanila, mas mainam nang magmukhang ipokrito kaysa atakehin o isantabi ang mga paniniwala at ideyal na gusto nilang paniwalaan at kamtin ng mga pinaghaharian – habang ginagawang imposible sa huli ang aktwal na pagkamit sa mga ito. Hindi pwedeng maging lubos na prangka o tanggalin ang tamis sa pagsasamantala.

The eight official entries have been selected out of 19 finished films that were evaluated. The entries were chosen based on the following criteria: Artistic Excellence – 40%; Commercial Appeal – 40%; Filipino Sensibility – 10% and Global Appeal – 10%.

MMDA and MMFF concurrent

chairperson Benhur Abalos urged the public to be one with the Filipino entertainment industry and the other stakeholders to make MMFF 2021 and the reopening of theaters a success.

"The long wait is over. There is no stopping the Metro Manila Film Festival. We are bringing back the MMFF to the silver screens that have been shut down for almost two years due to the coronavirus pandemic," said Abalos during the announcement of the official entries in Quezon City today.

The MMFF 2021 will showcase a diverse line-up of eight movies, ranging from social drama, horror, action, suspense, romance, to comedy horror, he added.

Abalos said the Inter-Agency Task Force and Department of Trade and Industry have set guidelines to ensure that cinemas adhere to all the safety protocols as "we are still facing threats of COVID-19 despite the easing of restrictions."

Aside from showing the movie entries in cinemas, the film festival 2021 will also hold a parade and awards night in December.

The MMFF is an annual event held every Christmas organized primarily to promote and enhance the preservation of the Philippine cinema. Proceeds from the film festival go to a number of beneficiaries in the film industry. (MMDA/PIA-NCR)

PH, other Asian nations highlight green funding benefits for developing countries

QUEZON CITY -- The Philippines, through the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), led Asian nations in the second climate fund replenishment talks to particularly seek funding support for developing countries to meet the 2030 international environmental goals.

DENR Secretary Roy A. Cimatu highlighted the significance of the 8th Global Environment Facility (GEF-8) Fund Replenishment discussions to finance projects for intensified environment protection against the coronavirus pandemic and climate-related calamities.

"There is a need to mobilize more resources to finance climate action and intensified environmental protection amidst the COVID-19 pandemic. GEF-8 is an opportunity that the countries should tap for this," Cimatu said.

The GEF was created in October 1991 to enable developing countries to address priority environmental concerns, such as deforestation, desertification, climate change, biodiversity loss, and ozone depletion.

DENR Undersecretary for Finance, Information Systems, and Climate Change Analiza Rebuelta-Teh represented Asian nations, which

include Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Cambodia, Iraq, Jordan, Laos, Lebanon, Sri Lanka, Malaysia, Mongolia, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Philippines, Thailand, Vietnam, Indonesia, Syria, and Yemen, during the global meeting held virtually on September 29 to October 1.

"The meeting comes at a crucial time as the world is in the COVID-19 crisis recovery stage," Rebuelta-Teh said, who served as the observer for GEF Asia and GEF Operational Focal Point for the Philippines.

She cited that Asian nations are united in the call to bring to the attention of GEF their support for the vulnerability index as a factor in the prioritization of GEF funding of projects.

The vulnerability index under the System for Transparent Allocation of Resources (STAR) is important in determining the real economic issues on the ground, Rebuelta-Teh said.

STAR is a performance-based framework for the allocation of resources from the GEF Trust Fund to countries over a replenishment period.

Rebuelta-Teh also noted that the vulnerability index especially applies among Least Developed Countries and Small Island Development States.

She pointed out that there is a need for increased

support for these nations.

Other recommendations include the intensified support for countries in their blue (ocean) and green (forestry) recoveries with the pandemic recovery factored in the GEF strategy.

Rebuelta-Teh said the Philippines is looking forward to sustained funding for its environmental projects in the next GEF four-year cycle, from July 2022 to June 2026.

GEF-8 is expected to reach US\$6.5 billion given an

increase in allocation for Non-Grant Instruments (NGI) and Small Grants Program (SGP). The allocation is meant to support the private sector and civil society participation in NGI and SGP.

The biggest chunk will be allocated for biodiversity (34 percent), followed by climate change (15 percent), chemicals and wastes (14 percent), international waters (12 percent), and land degradation (11 percent). About US\$157 million will be allocated for NGI and US\$256 million for SGP.

The replenishment negotiation process serves as a venue for donor countries to discuss and negotiate financial allocation sharing for the upcoming GEF replenishment

cycle.

It also provides the opportunity to review GEF performance and evaluate progress, assess future funding needs of the member-countries, and agree on the GEF financing framework.

The meetings are attended by representatives from four clusters of non-donor recipient countries, namely Africa, Asia, Eastern Europe, and Central Asia, including non-government organizations and the private sector.

The third GEF-8 Replenishment Meeting will be held on February 2022 followed by the fourth and last meeting on April-May 2022. (DENR)

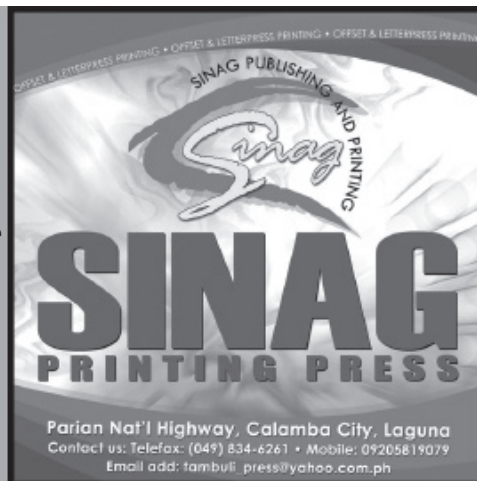

PH records highest daily jab rate with 1.23M, expects to expand vaccine coverage

PASIG CITY -- The Philippines recorded its highest daily vaccination throughput on November 11 with a total of 1,239,981 COVID-19 vaccine doses administered nationwide.

"We are very pleased to see that the hard work, determination, and concerted effort from all sectors of society has paid dividends and is bringing us closer to our goal of achieving 1.5 million daily jab rate," said National Task Force against COVID 19 Chief Implementer and vaccine czar Secretary Carlito G. Galvez Jr on Friday.

According to the latest data from the National Vaccination Operations Center showed that total jabs generated on November 11 is 1, 239, 981. Breakdown: 698, 500 as first

dose, and 541, 481 as second dose.

"The upward trajectory of our daily jab rate, along with the downtrend in the number of COVID-19 cases are solid proof that we are on the right track to a sustainable recovery," he added. Galvez said at least one million doses were administered for two consecutive days in the country, adding that a total of 1,052,600 doses were administered nationwide on November 10.

Data from NVOC showed that 37, 036, 577 doses have been administered as first dose, while 31,020,380 Filipinos are now fully vaccinated as of November 11.

"We are now building up the country's momentum

Eleazar retires with more public trust, confidence on PNP

CALOOCAN CITY -- Philippine National Police (PNP) Chief, Police General Guillermo Lorenzo T Eleazar said that he is bowing out after 38 years of service from a transformed police organization.

In the past six months, PGen Eleazar's Intensified Cleanliness Policy has done wonders for the PNP which has been struggling with its image, faced with accusations and perceptions of abuse and corruption.

From the PNP being 25th in public approval rating and 22nd in the trust rating in a survey among all government agencies, the PNP is currently 7th in the trust rating ranking and 8th in approval rating based on the Publicus Asia Inc survey conducted from October 11 to 18.

"Nag-umpisa tayo sa isang hamon na maibalik ang tiwala at respeto ng ating mga kababayan sa kanilang kapulisan. Today, we claim the victory from that almost impossible task of doing it in just six months because from the 25th ranking in approval rating and 22nd ranking in trust rating before, we are now ranked 7th in the trust rating and 8th in approval rating of all government agencies based on the survey conducted last month," said PGen Eleazar.

"Nang dahil sa lahat programa ng mga dating Chief PNP na nasimulan, nang dahil sa paniniwala at pakikipagtulungan ng bawat kapulisan upang ang lahat ng ito ay mapagtibay at maramdaman, at nang dahil sa tulong at gabay ng ating Poong Maykapal, masasabi ng bawat isa sa atin na iba na nga ang PNP ngayon," he added.

"As I bow out of the service today as a police officer and as your Chief PNP, I will take with me the good memories of how the men and women of the Philippine National Police believed in me and supported me in the main goal of continuously bringing back the integrity and dignity of the PNP in my last six months as a policeman," he said.

In his short tour of duty as the Chief PNP, PGen Eleazar was able to establish and strengthen transparency and accountability in the police organization by instituting reforms and working closely with different government agencies such as the Department of Justice and the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency as well as the judiciary, the Supreme Court in particular.

According to PGen Eleazar, "After almost 20 years the PNP and the PDEA, under the leadership of Director General Wilkins Villanueva, were able to finally produce a coordination

Sen. Bong Go says PRRD to approve IATF recommendation on the limited use of face shields

PASAY CITY -- Senator Christopher "Bong" Go said that based on his discussion with President Rodrigo Duterte, the latter agreed with the proposal of the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases on the limited use of face shields.

Go previously appealed to the IATF to reevaluate the mandatory use of face shields, citing the decreasing number

of cases in the country and the number of individuals who have been vaccinated.

"Sa pag-uusap namin ng Pangulo, aaprubahan na niya ang proposal ng IATF para limitado na lamang na paggamit ng mga face shields," said Go.

"Ang pangunahing proteksyon naman natin ay ang mask at ang bakuna. Dagdag na proteksyon ang face shield pero pwede nang hindi gawing

mandatory 'yan," he explained.

In Resolution No. 148-D (s. 2021) dated 11 November 2021, the IATF proposed the mandatory use of face shields in community settings for areas under Alert Level 5, Enhanced Community Quarantine, and granular lockdowns.

For areas under Alert Level 4, the local government units and private establishments
